Hearing God's Echo on Someone Else's Voice

Scripture: Luke10: 1 - 24

Chapter 10 of Luke is a full plate of spiritual nourishment. The chapter begins with Jesus' instruction to the disciples for their travels. In this early section of the chapter Jesus tells the disciples, "Whoever listens to you listens to me, and whoever rejects you rejects me, and whoever rejects me, rejects the one who sent me" (10:16). We read in this statement that listening to the message of God is a critical act of faith. To not listen to Jesus is to not listen to God, who sent him. This verse also reminds the disciples that those listening to them when they are in the act of teaching the good news of Jesus are listening to Jesus. This raises an expectation that their words need to be faithful to Jesus' teaching and preaching.

In verse 24, as Jesus tells the disciples "that many prophets and kings desired to see what you see, but did not see it, and to hear what you hear, but did not hear it. As people privileged to hear good news and ethical teaching, we therefore have the responsibility to pass on the teaching we are receiving to future generations

In the middle of this chapter is the story known as "The Good Samaritan." The Samaritan in the story is the one who has listened to the word of God and lives it out. The Samaritan had heard the echo of God's voice. All of us must listen to the voice of God and to respond. We, in CWF seek to hear and act on the voice of God in our lives.

Please join us as we celebrate the life of Betty Alexander, an outstanding example of discipleship.
